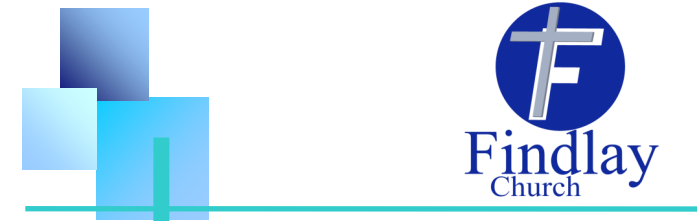

The Beginning

David Jack (DJ) Findlay - the founder of the Church, became a Christian in 1874, under the preaching of the visiting American Evangelist, DL Moody. As a young man, he started a kitchen meeting (House Group) in a small tenement flat just north of the present building. He very quickly became a popular preacher, and after a number of years of large tent missions in the St George's Cross area, the "Tabernacle" or "Tab" as it became known, was erected in 1894 and extended to its present size in 1907. Pastor Findlay died in 1938, but the witness of "Findlay" continues:- - -
